G. MINUTES

Ms. Grill moved to approve the following minutes:

1. Public Board meeting held Monday, March 3, 2008

Seconded by Mrs. Taylor and approved by a vote of 6-0.

H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Alvarez thanked Mrs. Sullivan and the Board members for all of their work and support during the budget process. Dr. Alvarez gave special thanks to Mrs. Lombard and Mr. Barr for being the Board representatives to the Board of School Estimate. He stated it was a difficult year but the Board got through it.

Dr. Alvarez spoke about the AVID program at the High School which received a \$42,000 grant from the Avington Foundation and that the Health & Wellness Partnership received a \$3,000 grant from Montclair State for a community health intern for this summer.

Dr. Alvarez thanked Boyce Ennis for putting together our Youth Explosion chorus last week which had about 500 students participating in it.

1. Ethics Training

Presented by Janet Lobsenz:

Ms. Lobsenz stated that the Ethics Act was passed in two phases. The first portion addresses the Conflict of Interest Act, which is represented by the forms that are filled out every April. The second portion made Board members training mandatory in which QSAC will be checking to make sure the training is done. This portion also adopted the New Jersey's School Boards Code of Ethics and made them statutory.

Ms. Lobsenz passed out a Code of Ethics Quiz for the Board, she highlighted the following regarding the Code of Ethics:

- Anyone can file a complaint against a School Board Members
- ◆ School Ethics Commission is the first to hear the complaint, then a formal recommendation is made to the Commissioner of Education who makes the final decision
- ◆ If a Board member has violated the Code they can be suspended, censured, reprimanded, or removed from the Board
- If a frivolous complaint is made there can be recourse
- The following actions are considered illegal under the Ethics Act
 - Action in an official capacity when the official or a member of his/her immediate family may benefit
 - Action in an official capacity when the official or a member of his/her immediate family has a direct/indirect financial involvement, if that action may reasonably be expected to impair the official's objectivity or judgment
 - Solicitation of a favor, loan, contribution, etc., that was given or offered to influence the official directly or indirectly

- ◆ An immediate family member is defined as: spouse, dependent and emancipated children and siblings
- You do not have to list the dollar value of your holding on your financial disclosure form
- You can not discuss or vote on the appointment of an immediate family member
- If you have a family member in the same statewide union you can not be involved in negotiations until after there has been a tentative agreement on the contract
- Political endorsement by the union prevents a Board member form participating in local negotiations for the year they are endorsed
- ♦ Board members costs are not covered for acts or omissions arising out of his/her official duties when the proceedings are criminal or quasi-criminal

Ms. Lobsenz stated that all Board members are officers of the State. Confidentially is a very important area. Currently there are more training requirements for new Board members than in the past, including training in QSAC and web site training.

Mr. Carlton asked about e-mail's and blogs. Ms. Lobsenz responded there has not been any rules on blogs as of yet, but anything that is done on a district's web site is public knowledge.

2. Science Curriculum

Presented by Mrs. Trigg-Scales and Dr. Moriarity:

Mrs. Trigg-Scales stated that the summary of the Science Curriculum will be presented by Dr. Moriarity and the actual curriculum will be distributed before the end of the year.

Dr. Moriarity stated that the Science K-8 curriculum is based on the 2004 New Jersey Core Content Standards as well as the 2008 New Jersey Clarification Process. At a meeting Mr. Hines, the State Science Supervisor, informed everyone that the New Jersey Science Committee is coming out with more specific standards. This summer they will be publishing deeper units that can be added to the curriculum at each of the grade levels. Standards include scientific process, science and safety, math applications, and nature & process of technology throughout K-8. As well as life science, physical science, earth science, astronomy, and environmental science. The standards are written sequentially and recognize that each of the years from K-8 the children will be exposed to earth science, physical science, and chemical science not just one topic a year.

The Board has been very generous the past three years in providing the new books the teachers have selected. Literature resources have been integrated for each of the grade levels, lab investigations have been added which will help the teacher to help differentiate and enrich or reinforce concepts for students. The Montclair Public School Technology standards have been integrated within the science websites as well as differentiated instruction forms for the teachers to help develop learning styles and activities.

Dr. Moriarty thanked a Montclair High School graduate that is doing his mentoring program for supervision and curriculum with the DOI and he has helped them very much.

Ms. Grill verified that the curriculum will be taught in a level appropriate to that grade. She also made sure that the curriculum is going to have all of the elements such as the assessment tools, the ability to teach to different levels, with everything built in.

Dr. Moriarty responded that these tools will be in two packets. The grade level curriculum is written for K-6 so that the fifth grade can look ahead to see what the sixth grade will be doing. The second packet is by grade level such as K-2, 3-5, and 6-8 which will have the other resources available in them.

Mr. Carlton asked about the achievement gap in science.

Mrs. Trigg-Scales responded that there are some gaps in science and now Montclair is at the point that we can start to focus on that gap. Science will now be looked at in more detail.

I. BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORTS

Mr. Barr thanked everyone for their support in the Board of School Estimate process.

Mrs. Taylor attended a Taste of China workshop which gave interesting statistics. One is that 200 million Chinese students are studying English, but only 24,000 American students are studying Chinese. She also thanked the School Board of Estimate for all of their hard work.

Ms. Grill thanked her fellow Board members for all of their support during the budget process especially Dr. Alvarez and Mrs. Sullivan.

Mr. Carlton also thanked his fellow Board members for their work done during the budget process. Mr. Carlton noted that the awards of contract resolutions related to the new school construction will be tabled.

Mrs. Sullivan informed everyone that bids for the new school were opened on March 19, 2008, and are still in the process of being reviewed. Several challenges arose from the bidders and the Board is investigating the legality of those challenges. The Board hopes to have a recommendation at the next Board meeting.
