I. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Alvarez stated that the district is proud of the efforts of the students in the Diplomatic Corps Program at Seton Hall University. The program is made possible, in part, through the generosity of Josh and Judy Weston. Under the direction of Ms. Liliya Panayev and Mr. Tom Manos, the program explores policy issues on a global level. The four Diplomatic Corps participants presented information about this program to the Board.

Mr. Manos gave a brief history of the Diplomatic Corp. which is a part of the Civics and Government Institute. This program is in its 7th year. It was designed in collaboration with Seton Hall University to expand our small learning community in creating better citizens locally, nationally, and internationally and also to give students another type of learning experience beyond just Montclair High School. Four years ago, this program expanded to work with Farleigh Dickenson University for video conferences. Montclair High is the only high school in the nation that participates in the video conferences.

Ms. Panayev is excited about working with this program. Ms. Panayev introduced:

Rachel Bradford – Ms. Bradford stated that past topics and video conferences have included poverty, women's health, children's rights, and terrorism.

Samuel Flood – Mr. Flood spoke on spring lectures which is a new component of the program. There will be lectures on open topics which will be opened to the public and will be related to current events and international relations.

Gregory Jamiolkowski – The students participate in Saturday sessions at Seton Hall which are held at 9 A.M. and features lessons and stimulations.

Julian Lucas – The students are able to speak directly with UN leaders and people throughout the country through the video conferences and experts during lectures.

Dr. Alvarez announced that Montclair was one of the districts that spearheaded a move to realign sports teams across the state to provide for more equity among teams. John Porcelli has worked with the NJSIAA to offer recommendations, which ultimately resulted in the realignment of fall and winter sports teams for the 2009-2010 school year.

Mr. Porcelli updated everyone on a vote at the state level to separate public and non-public Schools for athletics. The fourteen public schools in the NNJIL came together and spearheaded this legislation. The vote was lost by six votes to separate public and non public schools. There are many reasons why public schools do not want to compete against non-public schools, some are because of the enrollment numbers and others are how non-public schools attract students. There is also the issue of recruiting athletes to high schools for athletic purposes.

Mr. Porcelli is on the NJSIAA committee which took a look at this entire issue. Their recommendation is to realign sport teams for the entire state of New Jersey. The district's new conference is called the Super Essex Conference which is comprised of the 32 schools in Essex County.

Dr. Alvarez stated that the Quality Single Accountability Continuum state monitoring visit occurred this past Friday. The Superintendent's office oversaw the QSAC review of documents. Dr. Alvarez thanked Assistant Superintendent Terry Trig-Scales and members of Senior Staff for their contributions in making this assessment run smoothly. On all counts, the district believes it has performed exceedingly well. The state report is expected to be made public this coming April.

We typically present the enrollment report at this meeting. However, due to Mr. Dabney's absence we will postpone our report until January.
