### G. MINUTES

Mr. Rosenblum moved to approve the following minutes:

## H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Alvarez stated that the Tri–State Consortium visit was conducted. For three days 20 delegates from high performing school districts reviewed Montclair's reading and writing program. They shadowed students, met with teachers, and spoke with administrators. At the end of the visit, they gave Montclair a good report with some recommendations. Dr. Alvarez indicated that there will be a final report in about six weeks and it will be made public at the Board meeting as well as posted on the districts' website.

Dr. Alvarez stated the Quest Charter school submitted their  $5^{\rm th}$  application and hopes that it will be denied. He added that if approved it would result in a loss of \$2.3 million in funds for Montclair School District.

Dr. Alvarez acknowledged that the Civics and Government Institute at the High School received the Montclair National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) 2011 Community Service Award in recognition of CGI's contribution to the community. The award was presented at the Annual Thurgood Marshall Freedom Fund dinner on December 2.

Dr. Alvarez announced that the Montclair Fund for Educational Excellence (MFEE) finished its' Fall grant cycle and they are awarding approximately \$90,000 to the school district in terms of school level grants and teacher innovative projects.

Dr. Alvarez stated that the district has had an incredible athletic season. The Mounties made it to the State Finals. The Boys Soccer team with Coach Jack Webber finished with a record of 11 and 8. The team lost in the second round of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJ SIAA) State Tournament. The Girls Soccer team with Coach Chris Johnson finished with a record of 22; 1-in-1. They were Section Champions, Essex County Champions, NJSIAA Sectional Champions and Group 4 Semi-Finalist. The Field Hockey team ended the season with a 12; 7-1 record. They finished second in the Essex and Union League, and were Essex County Finalists and NJSIAA Sectional Finalists. A number of athletes from the Boys and Girls Cross Country teams qualified for the State competition and competed in individual State Sectional Meets. In Gymnastics, three girls qualified for State Individual competitions. The Cheerleaders took 3rd place in the Cheer for the Cure competition at Bloomfield High School.

Dr. Alvarez reported that Khalif Herbin, Star Quarterback was the Star-Ledger's Offensive Player of the Year and made first team All-State and Julian Pinnix-Odrick made All State and First Team All-State. In Girls Soccer Erika Joab Star-Ledger Soccer Player of the year Essex County First Team All-State and Mary Pitts also First Team All-State

## 1. Enrollment Report

Dr. Felice Harrison presented information to the Board about the enrollment report.

2. Submission of Revised Curriculum for Adoption 2011

*Dr. Hoover* presented information to the Board about the revised curriculum. He presented the Board with an Addendum to the curriculum in preparation for QSAC.

## 3. Quality Single Accountability Continuum

Dr. Alvarez presented information to the Board about QSAC which is a State monitoring process that has recently been changed. He stated that they visit the district every three years and this year it is being done differently. There are two parts to this process. There are statements of assurances that the Board President and Superintendent signs stating that certain things have in fact happened. The second piece has a performance review that shows how business is conducted across five strands: instruction, fiscal management, governance, personnel and operations. The District grades itself and the State tells agrees or disagrees with the Districts' grading. There are certain numbers assigned to each category.

Dr. Alvarez requested the Board to accept the report as presented so that the performance reviews and statements of assurance can be submitted to the New Jersey State Department of Education.

- 1. Committee Reports
  - a. Budget Committee

Mrs. Lombard stated that the budget working group met with Mrs. Sullivan on Friday to work on management tools that can be used to better manage the budget process. She stated that the \$11 million number is misleading. She clarified that of the \$11 million, \$2 million is reserved as required by the State for emergencies. It is a maximum of 2% of the District's budget. She added that \$3 million was already allocated and budgeted for and used in the current 20 11–2012 school year. The \$5.7 million was unexpected however it is only about \$2 million more than usual.

Mrs. Lombard stated that there will be a new working group to work on food services. The district has a new food service provider this year. She stated that there have been improvements in the quality of the food. Parents have continued to ask for healthier food. The idea of having this working group is to explore options which may result in an increase in costs of lunch or something that would involve more money by the Board. She added that the Board subsidized the lunch program by \$100,000 two years ago. Mrs. Sullivan fixed that last year and the Board is not anxious to get back into that situation again. Mrs. Lombard is asking the committee to look at the situation to see if there is broad support for healthier food, and what parents are willing to pay.

Ms. Larson stated that the Curriculum Committee met on Wednesday, December 14 where they discussed the following updates and issues:

- Progress report on the Small Learning communities at Montclair High School-Activities are underway which will allow students to select introductory courses in both the STEM and Entrepreneurial Small Learning Academies
- Development of 23 revised Curriculum Guides
- NJ QSAC Performance Review due on January 9, 2012. An on-site visit by members of NJ Department of Education will occur on February 24, 2012.

- Preliminary results of the Tri-State visit focused on protocols, practices, and implementation of the District-Wide Writing Program was shared with committee members
- The mentoring process used within the Montclair Public Schools was reviewed. Followup discussions will occur over the next several weeks

d. Resolution re: Revised Contract with Therapy Source to Provide Occupational and Physical Therapy Services

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5 states in part "Any purchase, contract or agreement ...may be made, negotiated or awarded by the Board of Education by resolution at a public meeting without public advertising for bids...", and

WHEREAS, the nature of these contract awards generally relate to the provision of professional services, and

WHEREAS, the Montclair Board of Education is in need of services to recruit, manage, and compensate independent contractors for therapy services, and

WHEREAS, Therapy Services will provide the following services for a period of one year September 2011 through June 2012:

\$93.00 per hour for speech, occupational and physical therapists
\$107.00 per hour plus travel time for speech, occupational and physical therapists servicing homecare,
special meetings or limited patient cases that are consistently, as determined by Therapy Source, less
than or equal to two hours of session service (minimum of one hour of service time is charge)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montclair School District approves the contract with Therapy Source.

e. Resolution re: Parental contract for Student Transportation 2011–2012 School Year–Student #011463

WHEREAS, the Montclair Board of Education is desirous of having the parent/legal guardian transport their child to and from Chapel Hill Academy, Lincoln Park, New Jersey, and WHEREAS, if the parent/legal guardian fully performs the services required by this contract, the Montclair Board of Education shall pay the parent/legal guardian \$3,960.00 to transport said child,
