Consultant's Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 16th day of March, 2015 by and between Ronald E. Bolandi, (hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant"), and the **MONTCLAIR BOARD OF EDUCATION** whose principal office is located at 22 Valley Road, Montclair, New Jersey 07042, (hereinafter referred to as the "BOARD").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to utilize the services of Consultant, specifically

Central Services Consultation (hereinafter referred to as "Educational Services" as requested by

Board President, and

WHEREAS, the Consultant is willing and able to provide such Educational Services to the Board, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to reduce to writing the understanding and agreement that exists between the Board and the Consultant,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual promises, it is agreed by and between the Board and Consultant as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> The Consultant hereby agrees to provide the Educational Services, specified above to the Board in accordance with all state laws and regulations from March 16, 2015 to March 31, 2015.
- 2. **Rate.** The Board hereby agrees to compensate Consultant at the rate of \$682.69 per diem, prorated for the number of hours worked, for the specified Educational Services as assigned and requested by Board.
- 3. <u>Termination</u>. It is hereby understood and agreed by Consultant that this Agreement may be immediately terminated by the Board upon written notice to Consultant for any reason, with or without cause.
- 4. <u>Compliance</u>. The Educational Services provided by Consultant shall comply with the applicable provisions of New Jersey Statutes, specifically, Title 18A and the New Jersey Administrative Code, specifically Title 6A.

- 5. <u>Confidentiality</u>. The Consultant agrees to maintain the strict confidentiality of all communications, records, documents, specifically including student records and other documents generated or provided for under this agreement according to federal, state and local laws and regulations.
- 6. <u>Professional Certification</u>. The Consultant shall possess the appropriate qualifications, licenses and certifications required by the New Jersey Department of Education.
- 7. <u>Criminal History / Background Check.</u> The Consultant shall be required to submit to and successfully complete a fingerprint and background check in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 18A:6-7.1 prior to providing services under this agreement. The Consultant shall also report their arrest or indictment for any crime or offense to the Board within 14 calendar days. The report shall include the date of arrest or indictment and charge(s) lodged against the Consultant. The Consultant shall also report the disposition of any charges within seven calendar days of disposition.
- 8. <u>Severability</u>. In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such holdings shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
- 9. <u>Choice of Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of New Jersey.
- 10. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Board and the Consultant and may not be amended or modified except by written instruments signed by the Board and the Consultant.
- 11. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice to the parties under this Agreement shall be sent certified mail, returned receipt requested, to the addresses set forth above.
- 12. **Board Approval.** This Agreement shall become effective upon the adoption of a resolution by the Board and execution of this Agreement by all parties.

THIS IS A LEGALLY BINDING DOCUMENT. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND SEEK LEGAL ADVICE. THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE THAT BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT THEY HAVE CONSULTED WITH LEGAL COUNSEL OR HAVE WAIVED SUCH RIGHT.
